

## **Sports Premium Funding 2018/19**

This year at St Anne's, we received an annual grant of £18,030 through the PE and Grant for primary schools. Over the years, we have used this sports grant to develop and deliver an engaging, challenging and high quality PE curriculum to all year groups.

For 2018/2019, we plan to continue to spend £2,850 of the grant towards employing a qualified 'Gymnastics Coach' to deliver a progressive programme of lessons to all children on a rotational basis over the year. Throughout gymnastic sessions, children learn a variety of techniques to help improve their balancing, posture and flexibility. To support this programme and to develop motivation in the pupils further, we have allocated a further £600 towards the provision of gymnastic certificates and badges to enable our children to celebrate a sense of achievement. There is also an after school gymnastic club available and the school plan to take part in the annual gymnastics festival to be held at Worksop Gymnastics Club. The Pupil Premium Grant enables all sports clubs to be accessible to all.

We employ a qualified 'Sports Coach' to deliver PE to children from Class Reception to Y6 to complement the teaching of pe by classteachers at a cost of £6200. Our sports coach also runs a variety of after school clubs including boys' and girls' football and multi-skills. As part of these clubs, he trains the football team to participate in the local schools league to which we pay a small subsidy.

We have also used £765 of the grant to take part in the Nottinghamshire School Games Package. This provides children between Y1-Y6 to take part in a range of sporting competitions and events such as athletics, handball, dodgeball, cricket, pop-lacrosse, basketball and a dance competition as well as effective cpd/training opportunities for the staff.

There is an allocation of £1000 towards the transport costs for the school to be able to take part in such competitions, thus ensuring the children join other children participating in a range of sports and developing not only healthy competition but peer to peer support also.

Further encouragement and development of the gross motor and fine motor physical skills of the children in Reception class are nurtured through a weekly movement to music/drama stimulus encompassing the themes taught in the class at a cost of £2160.

Our P.E Coordinator holds a budget of £400 of the SPG to incorporate specialist taster workshops and introduce our children to new opportunities during weeks such as sports week.

The remaining £4085 will be used to supplement the PE equipment following a recent internal audit as well as additional certificates and rewards for the range of sporting events that take place over the course of the year.

The impact of the way we use the sports grant is that all children at St Anne's benefit from high quality, timetabled provision from PE and sport experts and are enjoying a

sense of achievement. The importance given to sports by having a dedicated Sports Coach means that children are learning PE through a skills-based curriculum, which means that children gain new skills each year and are taught the basics early on. All our external 'bodies' bring a sense of passion and enthusiasm towards physical exercise and maintaining a healthy lifestyle. This, in turn has a positive effect on self-esteem and wellbeing of all children.

Over time, the use of matching sports kits to wear throughout sporting events, supports our ethos of a St Anne's community, aiming to promote a sense of unity and highlights the importance of teamwork and sportsmanship, thus increasing self-esteem.

In relation to swimming, children in Y3-Y4 receive swimming lessons throughout a proportion of their school year. Of the children currently working in Y6, 23 of the 27 children are able to swim confidently and proficiently over a distance of 25. Of these children, 22 of them are able to use a range of strokes effectively. Furthermore, 23 of the 27 children are able to demonstrate a range of safe self-rescues in different water situations if necessary. It is anticipated that the children in Year 6 who need to refine their skills further will join the other classes for additional opportunities.
